Chester Students' Union (CSU) is looking for 4 students to join our Elections team this Spring! In these Elections, we'll be electing part-time Union Assembly Officers, as well as three full-time Officers, who are paid representatives who lead CSU for a whole year.

As democracy is so important to us, we want to make sure that as many students as possible are involved with and knowledgeable about our Elections. **That's where you come in!**

You'll be responsible for being an ambassador for these Spring Elections, talking to as many students as possible and encouraging them to get involved, whether that's by nominating themselves, attending a workshop, or voting.

The role will be completely flexible in a way that works for you and your schedule - you can fit it around your studies and other work. The work itself is also super flexible, and we expect every Elections Ambassador will have different strengths, social connections, and skills which contribute to their role and how they want to do it.

You'll receive full training and will be starting your role on the 2nd February. We welcome students from every campus and University Centre to apply, as your interview and training can take place via Teams.

Key Responsibilities:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use initiative to establish and/or utilise connections to engage with as many students as possible • Encourage students to attend Elections information sessions and manifesto-writing workshops • Encourage students to nominate themselves for a full-time or part-time role • Encourage students to vote • Roam campuses/centres to inform students about Elections activities during voting and nomination periods • Answer questions from students about the Elections, Union Assembly, and full-time Officer positions • Be available on voting days to help CSU staff as required, as well as students who have questions or concerns • Track what work you have completed for the role • Attend training for the role
